## **DWP Board of Commissioners Vacancies – *Application deadline extended to August 1***

BIG BEAR LAKE, CA – The City of Big Bear Lake is asking for the community's help in filling **(2)** vacancies on the Department of Water & Power (DWP) Board of Commissioners. The vacancies occurred when Commissioner Bill Speyers recently resigned his post and Commission Vice-Chair Susan Conley's term expired on June 30, 2007. Speyers term was set to expire on June 30, 2009. The new appointment will complete his unexpired term. The full-term appointment to fill Conley's vacated seat will expire on June 30, 2011.

The DWP Board of Commissioners is a five-member body appointed by the City Council. Currently, the Commission meets the fourth Tuesday of every month at 8:00 a.m., at the DWP offices on Garstin Road. Responsibilities include decisions related to water conservation, supply, generation, distribution & sale of water and related services. Commissioners are required to attend all regularly scheduled meetings and all subsequent ones the Commission may call for.

To serve on the Commission, an appointee must be a full-time resident of Big Bear Lake and a registered voter. Applications can be obtained from the Civic Center, located at 39707 Big Bear Blvd.; on-line at [www.citybigbearlake.com](http://www.citybigbearlake.com) or by contacting the City Clerk's office at (909) 866-5831. The deadline to submit applications has been **extended** to Wednesday, August 1, 2007 at 5 p.m. The City Council will interview prospective candidates.
