Do a good deed this Holiday Season – Recycle Your Christmas Tree

BIG BEAR LAKE, CA – From December 26th through January 19th, Big Bear Lake residents can bring their Christmas trees to Clean Bear Site #1, located at 41970 Garstin Drive, for them to be recycled. Trees should be placed in the marked location on the East side of the Recycle Center. Trees will not be accepted if decorations, tinsel, ornaments, lights or stands are still attached – residents should remove these items prior to arriving at the collection site. Flocked trees, however, will be allowed. Last year, 965 trees were collected. For more information, residents can call Big Bear Disposal at (909) 866-3942.
